Short description/ Goal of the game:

The game includes 100 double sided photo cards. Every player receives a card with a number (1-10) and a meeple of the same color as the card. Also everyone gets 10 cards with the numbers 1-10 to vote.

One by one a photo is placed on the board. Then all players vote secretly who they think which of the other players 'matches' that photo. Voting cards are turned and points collected.

Educational value/ Learning Objectives:

- Icebreaking
- What are your prejudices, how do others see you?
- Conversation in the group and ask students for arguments for their choices.
- Getting to know each other

























Recommendations for use:

- for new teams getting to know each other by discussing preconceived notions about each other
- You can use the cards for a storytelling game
- Playing in teams

Pro's & Contra's:

- Before you start take a look at the photo's, maybe you have to select some.
- Be careful that this game is not going to be something only about prejudice. Take the time to reflect: why did you choose him/here? What is the reaction of that person?

Tips and Tricks for Facilitators

How to adapt game for different groups, topics, occasions/needs

- Awareness of judgments and/or of your appearance

Feedback questions

-What can I learn from this activity? -Did you find that some answers surprise you?

Further discussion topics

-How do you look at people after this game?

-What are you proud of when people voted at you?

- Are there things you want to change?
